## AIDS woes keep students awake

A group of University of Ottawa students is planning to pull an all-nighter this weekend, but they won't be staying up to finish term papers.

The 24-Hour Wake is a fundraising event organized by the Ottawa chapter of the Children's AIDS Health Program, and starting at 10 a.m. today, participants are challenged to stay awake until 10 a.m. tomorrow.

More than 50 people will gather for events at various locations around the University of Ottawa campus for the Wake's activities.

"We're going to have a combination of high energy events to help everyone stay awake, like a scavenger hunt around Ottawa U, dance workshops, and sexual awareness events," said Ottawa CAIDSHP chapter spokesman Jesse Janssen.

"It's a twofold awareness of HIV/AIDS in general, and HIV/AIDS in underdeveloped countries," Janssen said.

The group hopes to raise at least \$3,000, which will help fund an international mission to India this summer to spread the awareness of AIDS and hold workshops at hospitals, orphanages, and schools.
